Statement: All teachers will receive (job embedded) professional learning opportunities and resources to implement instructional classroom routines and activities to improve the learning culture as measured by increased favorable responses of 85% or more on our stakeholder surveys.

Data Story Name: Learning Culture

*Initial Data Analysis:* We are seeing a plateau in achievement in our core academic areas. We see fluctuations that can be attributed to cohorts of students rather than sustained improvements in achievements. Our scores in Math have been lower than ELA. Our data show students struggle with using foundational skills to the next level.

Initial Initiative Inventory and Analysis: Our mission is to have lifelong learners that have foundational knowledge to be successful at each school level and through life. All teachers are involved in grade level initiatives and the central office through the curriculum director supervises the curriculum selection process, alignment and resource allocation. As a district, we have tried a number of initiatives to differentiate resources/support to meet the individual needs of students. We utilize a variety of data sources listed in our Initiative Inventor to look at our data and programs to see what we can do to improve student achievement.

#### Resource Allocation Review:

*Gap Analysis:* As a district, we find many of our students are struggling in foundational skills and knowledge. We estimate that approximately 30% of our students are both motivated and capable mathematically to meet grade level standards, 60% ELA, and less than 30% for Science and social studies.

District Data Story Summary: We have identified the following strengths: data collection & intervention k-6, jr/sr high has course offerings to meet the needs of students, We have room for improvement in foundational skills as students transition from one level to the next. We have identified by the end of 3rd Grade students have already determined if they are "good" at "school" or not.

Jr/Sr HS there is not an intervention program, at elementary the transition from 3rd+ we see a drop off in student scores and attitude toward learning (we also begin to see parental attitude toward influencing student attitudes)

One major challenge identified is establishing a positive Learning Culture to support problem solving, grit, stamina, and application of prior knowledge to new learning.

Our learners at greatest risk of not receiving T2 & T3 support are students at the Jr/Sr



High. This is because we do not have MTSS at that level.



## Strategies:

(1/1): FIT Teaching: Purposeful Planning Component

Owner: Jodi Bucher

Summary: FIT Teaching from Fisher & Frey is an intentional and targeted approach to purposeful planning. The framework can be found in the book, "Intentional and Targeted Teaching: A Framework for Teacher Growth and Leadership". FIT Teaching has 5 main components. The first component, Planning with Purpose, highlights the work that teachers do to prepare lessons as they analyze the standards for their grade level or content area, identify learning targets and success criteria, and sequence learning. The key indicators in this component are: focusing on learning intentions and progressions; evidence of learning; meaningful learning.

*Gap Analysis:* If we enhance our academic tiered delivery system, then we will increase our capacity to meet student needs. (scheduling & resources) So far, almost half to half of our students are not proficent in ELA and math. Our goal is to incarease this proficiency rate 15% or more by 2026.

District Data Story Summary: Overall, the data shows that our students could benefit from additional academic support. By continuing with current supports and adding additional ones we should see a marked improvement in student outcomes. Currently, our 3rd-8th graders ELA and math partly proficent or not proficient rates are as follows:

### (2/5): 23g Expanded Learning Time

Summary: EdTrust defines expanded learning time (ELT) as programs or strategies implemented to increase the amount of instruction and learning students experience. ELT strategies include afterschool, summer, and in-school programs. The evidence suggests that extended learning time programs, including extended school day (ESD), extended school year (ESY), and expanded learning opportunities (ELO) programs that provide academic services during out-of-school time hours, can be effective in improving a range of educational outcomes for students. Findings also suggest that extended learning time programs may be more advantageous for low-income, low-performing, ethnic minority or otherwise disadvantaged students.

Summary: A trained adult advocate can help students who have fallen off track by providing individualized support to meet their academic, personal, and emotional needs. An advocate is a student's "go-to person" for the resources and support needed to graduate, and typically provides these supports for the entire time a student is enrolled in the school, or, at a minimum, for a full school year. Advocates can be school staff or not employed by the school district. Advocates can identify unmet needs and provide or coordinate more intense, individualized support to help students get back on track for graduation.
